



Lesson 58

When a *sâkin* ن is followed by a ب, the ن changes to م². To indicated this a small م is written aboved the ن, e.g.,

مِنْ مَبِينٍ It is pronounced : mim baini (not : min baini).

This rule applies to the *nûn* of the *tanwîn* also, e.g.,

صُمُّكُمْ. This is pronounced: şumm-um bukm-un (not: şumm-un bukm-un)

This change happens even if the ن and the ب are in a single word, e.g.,

الْأَنْبِيَاءُ. It is pronounced : al-'ambi yā'u (not : al-' ambi yā'u).
